Welcome to Wyndham-Carseland Provincial Park.

Enjoy the shade and beauty of the cottonwood forest along the Bow River in summer. Wyndham-Carseland Provincial Park is a great place to get away from it all, without having to travel far; ideal for fishing, canoeing, bird watching, picnicking and just relaxing by the river.

Nearby, Lake McGregor, Travers Dam Campground, Little Bow Reservoir and Little Bow Provincial Park all have boat launch facilities, camping and picnicking areas for your enjoyment.

Safety

- Follow safe boating regulations at all times and always use caution when near the banks of the river.
- Beat the heat; stay hydrated and in the shade when possible, wear a sun hat, loose fitting clothing and sunscreen

Camping

- Keep your campsite clean; use recycling and garbage containers throughout the campground.
- The maximum number of motor vehicles, tents, RV's and trailers permitted on the campsite is three, of which only two may be used for sleeping quarters.
- Additional camping fees are charged for 2nd accommodation unit on a campsite unless 2nd accommodation unit is a tent and there is only one motor vehicle registered to the site.
- No more than 6 people may occupy a campsite, unless they are all members of a single family unit.
- Quiet time is from 11 pm – 7 am.
- Consider your neighbours, keep generator use to an absolute minimum and respect quiet times.

Parking

Park in designated parking areas or on the graveled portion of your campsite. Please do not park vehicles or trailers on the grass.

Pets

Keep your pet on a leash, pick up after them and be sure they are supervised at all times. Pets are not allowed in washrooms, in the comfort camping units or other public buildings.

Wildlife

The cottonwood forest and river valley habitat here are an important and rare area on the prairie that supports nesting and migrating birds. Take some time and watch the yellow warblers or American gold finches dart amongst the underbrush, or catch a glimpse of the elusive northern flicker. Listen for the chatter of the black-capped chickadee and red breasted nuthatch high in the treetops. Keep your eyes to the sky to see raptors such as the Swainson's hawk, red-tailed hawk or bald eagle. The Lower Bow River running through Wyndham-Carseland Provincial Park is a Blue Ribbon section of the river, host to 2500 brown and rainbow trout per mile. The average size is from 15"-22", with fish in the mid-twenties caught daily.
