Trail Planning Guidelines

Category	Use Designation	Trail Development Guidelines
PINK	Sensitive Summer Ecological Areas	New or existing trails may be permitted but would only be open in winter to minimize human disturbance during the sensitive period.
BLUE	Sensitive Winter Ecological Areas	New or existing trails may be permitted but would only be open in summer to minimize human disturbance during the sensitive period.
GREEN	Habitat Patches and Sensitive Ecological Areas	New trails may be approved if there is no net increase in access density.
YELLOW	Wildlife Corridors	Trails are not generally permitted but may be considered under specific conditions, i.e., only perpendicular crossings, spaced no less than 1km apart.
ORANGE	Preservation Zones & Sensitive Ecological Areas	Limited to existing designated trail network. Note: Orange category may contain areas where no trails are permitted due to wildlife sensitivity.
